Girl Scouts is joining forces with the Elliot Wildlife Value Project and American Forests to launch a bold tree-planting initiative. We are setting out to plant 5 million trees by 2026. Not only is this great for wildlife, but it will also provide tangible climate solutions.

Girl Scouts everywhere are being called to help by planting, protecting, and honoring trees in their backyards, communities, states, across the country, and even across the

# THE START OF A TROOP ADVENTURE IS

Learn about building fires, outdoor cooking, staying safe and all things "Girl Scout Program in the Outdoors." By the end of the session you will have an excellent start on planning and preparing your very first outdoor adventure with your troop.

This training is required for at least one troop leader before bringing girls on an overnight in tents or before cooking over a fire. Dress comfortably and for the weather as much of the time will be spent outdoors, rain or shine. Lunch is provided.

What better way to celebrate 109 years of Girl Scouting than by joining together with your sister Girl Scouts from around Wisconsin for a special virtual Girl Scout Advocacy Day!

The 90 minute workshop will feature opportunities for all girls to connect directly with state lawmakers and

voice the issues important to them. Girl Scouts will hear from inspiring female legislators who will share their stories, take a virtual tour of the state capitol, and more.

#### **GIRL SCOUT WEEK: MARCH 7-13**



Throughout the year, girls and adults celebrate some very special days in Girl Scouting. Girl Scout Week is celebrated each March, starting with Girl Scout Sunday and ending with Girl Scout Sabbath on a Saturday, and it always includes the Girl Scout Birthday, March 12, which commemorates the day in 1912 when Juliette Gordon Low officially registered the organization's first 18 girl members in Savannah, Georgia. Girl Scouts will be 109 years old this year!

Girl Scout Sunday and Girl Scout Sabbath give girls an opportunity to attend their place of worship to be recognized as a Girl Scout. If a place of worship is the group sponsor, girls may perform a service, such as greeting, ushering or doing a flag ceremony.
