The Girl Scout Family Connection guide was provided to you to give to each Girl Scout in your troop. This 20-page guide highlights the benefits of Girl Scouting and outlines ways for parents to get involved with their daughter and your troop. There's even a place for girls to record their Girl Scout adventures all year long. Make the distribution of this guide a troop activity by having girls write or draw their hopes and dreams for the troop year on page four. It is also a great resource for parent meetings. - Girl Scouting's Highest Awards to which girls aspire

To Re-register Your Troop:

Troop leaders should have received an email listing all girls and adults in your troop. If you need it sent again, send an email with your troop number to nate@gsmanitou.org.

- 1. Review the information. Note where there are changes (addresses, email addresses, grades, schools attending, members not returning, etc.) to **reregistering** members so you can mark those on the registration form. Gather the names and corresponding email addresses for **new** girls and adults joining your troop. (You will not be paying for new girls or adults with this form, however.)
- 2. Click on the link provided in the email. Complete the information, and submit it with the \$30 girl membership dues and \$25 adult membership dues for each **reregistering** member, in the form of credit or debit card, PayPal, program credits (you will need the program credit certificate code for each girl using program credits), or gift card.
- 3. Once we receive your reregistering information, we will send you an email to send to all new girls and new adults joining your troop. (Be sure to include your name, email, and troop number when you send it to them, as they will need this info to register!) The email you send them will include a link where they can submit all necessary information, along with their membership dues. You will receive confirmation when they have done so. That's it!

To Register a New Troop:

Troops of all new girl and adult members will need to have parents (of girl members) and adult members complete the appropriate registration form provided in your troop packet, collect the membership dues (\$30 for girls, \$25 for adults) for each person, and mail or deliver the membership forms and membership dues to the Girl Scout Center. This can also be completed online.

Preparing New Troop Leaders

We have three easy steps for new leader onboarding!

- 1. Attend an in-person orientation for new leaders.
- 2. Complete the *New Leader Onboarding: What Girl Scouts Do* training available on gsLearn.
- 3. Complete the *Volunteer Toolkit 101* training available on gsLearn.

Once you have completed all three steps, please complete the **New Leader Learning Quiz**, which can also be accessed via gsLearn. All steps are required to be completed by new leaders within three months of appointment.

Volunteer Toolkit Updates

Using the Volunteer Toolkit is critical to great Girl Scout Program. Explore all year long without starting over! Now the Explore Tab adds-on to your meeting plan instead of resetting it. Combine pre-selected tracks or add individual meetings, the choice is yours! If you need to delete your plan and start over, the Delete button is on the Year Plan tab.

What else is new?

- Even more information about the Girl Scouts in a troop all in one place, grade, communication preferences and secondary caregiver information has been added to the My Troop Tab.
- Use the New for 2023-2024 filter when searching for meetings (Explore Meetings or when you Add Badge/Journey) to find everything new in one easy place.
- Invite topic experts to share their knowledge and passion with your troop. Use the Speaker Invite under Manage Communication on the meeting plan to get started.

New and Newly Updated Badges for Girl Scouts

Get ready to change the world! New Girl Scout badges are here - and Girl Scouts has added even more skill-building, friend-making, life-changing experiences to the Girl Scout program! There's never been a better time for girls to practice ambitious leadership - and there's no better place to do it than at Girl Scouts. This year, Girl Scouts added new Maker and Animal badges.

- Maker badges: There are three badges for each level (Daisy, Brownie, and Junior), including: Art and Design, Craft and Tinker, Create and Innovate.
- **Animal badges:** There is a new animal badge for Girl Scout Daisies. The Junior and Cadette animal badges are newly updated, with the Cadette badge featuring a new design as well.
- STEM Career Exploration badges: Newly added Daisy, Senior, and Ambassador STEM Career Exploration badges complete the badge line for all levels. Troop leaders can add these to their year plan in the Volunteer Toolkit! From your Year Plan, use the Add Badge/Journey button to search for "STEM career" and choose meetings 1 and 2 for your program level.
