Take your troop on an adventure of a lifetime! This spring, we're offering a session for you and your troop to get outside and explore the outdoors together. Whether it's your first overnight adventure or you're a seasoned pro, your troop will have a blast at camp! We take care of the housing, food, and some of the activities. Many of the activities will be led by our amazing camp counselors, but when you're not participating in counselor-led activities you will be able to do activities that your troop enjoys. You can relax and unwind or work on a badge or journey. We will provide basic supplies for badge work (markers, scissors, glue, etc.), but you will be

responsible for bringing additional supplies along if they are needed.

This is the perfect introduction to camp for girls who are still a bit unsure about spending the night at camp and for troops who want to camp together without needing to plan all of it. You'll participate in regular camp activities but also have plenty of time with just your troop.

Supervision is not provided. Troops will need the required amount of leaders/adults to meet safety requirements. If a troop can't make it, individual girls are able to attend and bring along their favorite adult (much like our Moms, Pops, and Pals camp session). All adults attending must be registered as Girl Scout members and pass a background check.

Check-in: Saturday, April 29th 8:00-8:30 a.m. | **Check-out:** Sunday, April 30th 9:00 a.m. **Cost:** \$75 per person (adults needed for supervision are free. Additional adults pay \$75 each) **Register here by April 22.**


Summer Troop Camp at Camp Evelyn

Whether it's your first overnight adventure or you're a seasoned pro, your troop will have a blast at camp! We take care of the housing, food, and some of the activities. Virtual Program Aide Adventure

Do you feel ready to take on a leadership role in Girl Scouts? Learn how to lead activities, songs, arts, and more! Once you complete the program aide training you can come to camp as a volunteer for day camp or you can volunteer with a younger troop. During this day of virtual learning and growing, girls will complete their volunteer hours to earn the Program Aide pin. This training is required before girls can volunteer at camp this summer.

You may begin entering information in the finance report at any time (it is already available), but please do not hit submit until the end of the Girl Scout year as information cannot be edited after it is submitted. The Annual Finance Report is due by **June 5, 2023**. It is important that you submit the report in a timely matter. Girl Scout Week: March 12-18



Throughout the year, girls and adults celebrate some very special days in Girl Scouting. Girl Scout Week is celebrated each March, starting with Girl Scout Sunday and ending with Girl Scout Sabbath on a Saturday, and it always includes the Girl Scout Birthday, March 12, which commemorates the day in 1912 when Juliette Gordon Low officially registered the organization's first 18 girl members in Savannah, Georgia. Girl Scouts is celebrating 111 years this March!

Girl Scout Sunday and Girl Scout Sabbath give girls an opportunity to attend their place of worship to be recognized as a Girl Scout. If a place of worship is a sponsor, girls may perform a service, such as greeting, ushering, or doing a flag ceremony.
