Whether they're a social butterfly, creative thinker, or strategic innovator, every Girl Scout entrepreneur has their own kind of magic. And Girl Scout Cookie Season is the perfect time to harness that magic and achieve their goals! Girls use their best and brightest strategies to help maximize their cookie sale success.

Before the cookie sale...

Here are a few steps you can take now that will assure your troop has a super successful cookie sale:

- 1. Recruit your troop's cookie sale manager and register them as a member. Troops must have a registered troop cookie manager before they can receive their troop cookie sale materials, have access to eBudde (the cookie sale management site) and for girls/parents to be able to access Digital Cookie. If you are going to act as the troop cookie sale manager yourself, please let us know.
- 2. Set up your troop's bank account. Troops must have an active bank account to participate in the cookie sale. Check out the section on troop finances in **Volunteer Essentials** to open your bank account. Troops can also set up an app payment system like Venmo, PayPal, and Apple or Google Pay that links to the troop bank account. Parents can obtain payment from traditional sales customers using these phone payment apps and also pay the troop for their daughter's cookie order, avoiding any non-sufficient funds check charges to troop accounts. - 3. Communicate regularly with your Girl Scout parents about the cookie sale. First, customize the Cookie Sale 101 letter that is in the *Resources* section of your Volunteer Toolkit under "Cookie Program." You'll also need to have your Girl Scout parents complete the Parent Permission Form. You can find the permission form in three places: the Volunteer Toolkit, on our website at bit.ly/CookieParentPermission, and linked in the Cookie Sale 101 letter. Parents must complete, sign (digital signature is OK), and turn in the permission form before girls receive a cookie order card. Leaders give this completed, signed form to the troop cookie sale manager to aid her in ordering girl rewards. Retain completed signed copies until all girls' monies are received from cookie sales.

Cookie Sale Basics

Each community has a community cookie sale manager who meets with local troop cookie sale managers to help facilitate their troop cookie sale. Community cookie sale managers will contact registered troop cookie sale managers in November/December and provide information regarding their local cookie meeting (may be a virtual meeting). Troop cookie sale managers receive their troop cookie sale materials from their community cookie sale manager and have access to the online girl ordering system, eBudde, in early December.

Cookies will sell for \$5 and \$6 for specialty cookies (S'mores and Toffee Tastic).

Council staff will be checking troop accounts to confirm that the correct amount of deposit was made into the troop account, but troop leaders should also check their troop account for correct deposit amounts. All monies owed by girls, all cookie booth monies, and troop proceeds must be deposited into the troop account.

Troop Cookie Sale Managers should encourage all parents to use Digital Cookie. Customers pay for all digital orders with a valid credit card at the time of ordering. There are no transaction or credit card fees to customers, but customers pay to have cookies shipped. The use of Digital Cookie precludes Troop Cookie Sale Managers having to deal with checks or large amounts of cash from parents. The issuance of non-sufficient checks and non-payment by parents was virtually non-existent in the 2023 Cookie Sale because of the increased use of Digital Cookie. And girls who use Digital Cookie and traditional sales methods sell more cookies than girls who just use traditional selling methods.

NEW for 2024! Girls/parents will be able to add their total cookie order from their Girl Scout Cookie order card to Digital Cookie, thus saving data entry for Troop Cookie Sale Managers. Troop Cookie Sale Managers and parents will receive instructions on this procedure.

Troop Reward

Troops who sell an average of 200 packages per registered girl in their troop will earn one-day tickets to either Kalahari Water and Theme Park in Wisconsin Dells, Tundra Lodge in Green Bay, Renaissance Faire in Bristol Wisconsin, or the Milwaukee Zoo, or a cash deposit to the troop account of \$150-\$250 depending on number of registered girls in the troop selling cookies.

Girls in qualifying troops (troops that sell 200 per registered girl average) have to sell a minimum of 40 packages to earn a ticket. The sales average of troops with 11 or more registered girls is calculated on 90% of registered girls.

Leaders will receive tickets for adults to meet Girl Scouts of the USA's girl/adult ratio for troop trips. Instructions for ordering additional adult tickets will be shared at a later date.

December Holidays and Cookie Selling...

Beginning December 15, 2023, Digital Cookie will be open for all customer orders. No social media sales to family and friends before December 15, 2023. No door-to-door sales until January 4, 2024. Girls/parents will receive a registration email in early December so they can set up the girl's digital webpage.

Parents must have a current, valid email on file to access Digital Cookie. Volunteers will receive a registration email two days prior to parents receiving their email.

Troop Gift of Caring

Prior to the cookie sale, troop leaders and cookie sale managers should work with girls to choose a local organization to whom to donate cookies. Girls ask customers to purchase a few packages to donate to this local organization. Troop Gift of Caring cookies are part of the troop order and are received with the troop order at cookie delivery.



Important dates for the 2024 Cookie Sale

- **December 15:** Digital Cookie opens for all orders.
- January 4 January 20: Door-to-door sales.
- **January 21:** Girl orders due to Troop Cookie Sale Manager.
- **January 22, 11:59 p.m.:** Troop orders submitted via the online ordering system, eBudde.
- **January 21 March 17:** Digital Cookie remains open for shipped and donated cookies.
- **February 8:** Cookies may be picked up from local cookie cupboards. Volunteers must place the cupboard order in eBudde.
- **February 8 March 17:** Troops hold booth sales.
- **February 9-19:** Community cookie delivery begins. Community Cookie Sale Managers will know their delivery date by November 2023.
- March 1: Girl monies due to Troop Cookie Sale Manager.
- **March 5:** Troop Cookie Sale Managers deposit all cookie monies into the TROOP ACCOUNT. Troop Cookie Sale Managers should avoid taking large checks from parents as they may result in non-sufficient check fees to the troop account.
- March 7: Manitou Council will debit troop accounts 65% of the total amount owed to the council.
- March 18: Troop Cookie Sale Managers will submit their FINAL troop reward order in eBudde.
- March 25: Manitou Council will debit troop accounts for the balance owed to the council.
- April 22 (approximately): Troop Cookie Sale Managers will receive girl rewards.





Troop leaders should work with girls and Troop Cookie Sale Managers to decide if they want to have a booth sale. Cookie Booths are held from **February 8 to March 17, 2024**. Troops may choose from pre-set dates and time slots at Pick 'n Save and Festival Foods stores. Beginning **9:00 a.m. Saturday, January 6 through January 13**, troops will be able to select three open time slots at each store to hold a booth sale. **January 14 - February 4** troops can select any amount of open time slots. Troops can schedule booths with other local businesses.

Troop Cookie Sale Managers and/or Troop Leaders can preorder booth cookies from a local cupboard via eBudde for pick up on or after **February 8.** Each cupboard will have set days and times for pick up and returns. The benefit of preordering from a cupboard is that troops may return full, unopened cases of

unsold cookies within seven days of pick up. No returns are accepted for cookie booth cookies ordered via eBudde with a troop's initial order.

Troops who sell 132 packages in booth sales earn one-night building rental for a troop getaway or a pool party at camp in the summer. Troops who sell 252 packages earn two-nights building rental. Note: during the peak summer months of June - August, a two-night reward is required for a one-night camp building rental. This is a very popular reward and is earned by most troops holding booth sales.

Troop Cookie Sale Managers can allocate cookies sold at booths to girls in their troop but if they want to earn the troop cookie booth reward, they cannot allocate all booth cookies to girls. 132 or 252 packages must be left unallocated to girls for the troop to receive the booth reward. Troop Cookie Sale Managers will receive instructions and reminders on following this procedure.

Cookie Business Badges & The Cookie Entrepreneur Family Pin

Cookie Business and Financial Literacy badges are a great way to assure girls learn entrepreneurship skills from the cookie sale. **Explore them now!**

The United States Mint has included our trailblazing founder Juliette Gordon Low among the honorees for the 2025 American Women Quarters Program! This program features coins with designs reflecting the accomplishments and contributions of American Women. This is a wonderful way to celebrate Juliette and her vision of a Movement that prepares girls for leadership. Our inspirational Girl Scouts today are the true reflections of Juliette's legacy. The designs for the quarters will be unveiled in spring 2024, and they will go into circulation in 2025.

Other honorees announced for 2025 include:

- legendary investigative journalist, civil rights activist, researcher, and co-founder of the NAACP Ida B. Wells.
- trailblazing astronomer Dr. Vera Rubin, who pioneered work on galaxy rotation rates.
- activist Stacey Park Milbern, who helped create and build the disability justice movement.
- barrier breaking tennis champion Althea Gibson, the first Black athlete to win a Grand Slam title and the first Black player to compete on the Women's Professional Golf Tour.
