# Family Connection A Guide to Welcome Families

to Girl Scouts

The Girl Scout Family Connection guide was provided to you to give to each Girl Scout in your troop. This 20-page guide highlights the benefits of Girl Scouting and outlines ways for parents to get involved with their daughter and your troop. There's even a place for girls to record their Girl Scout adventures all year long. Make the distribution of this guide a troop activity by having girls write or draw their hopes and dreams for the troop year on page four. It is also a great resource for parent meetings. There are sections about:

- What Girl Scouting is all about
- How to live the Girl Scout Promise and Law at home
- Badge and patch placement on sashes and vests
- Girl Scouting's Highest Awards to which girls aspire
- A yearly calendar feel free to add your troop activities as well
- Information about the program pillars — STEM, Outdoors, Life-Skills and Entrepreneurship
- The Girl Scout Cookie Program Let your Area Manager, Troop Organizer, or membership staff member know if you need more than those in your packet. We want each Girl Scout to get a Girl Scout Family Connection Guide.

#### To Reregister Your Troop:

Troop leaders should have received an email listing all girls and adults in your troop. If you need it sent again, send an email with your troop number to <a href="mailto:nate@gsmanitou.org">nate@gsmanitou.org</a>.

- 1. Review the information. Note where there are changes (addresses, email addresses, grades, schools attending, members not returning, etc.) to **reregistering** members so you can mark those on the registration form. Gather the names and corresponding email addresses for **new** girls and adults joining your troop. (You will not be paying for new girls or adults with this form, however.)
- 2. Click on the link provided in the email. Complete the information, and submit it with the \$30 girl membership dues and \$25 adult membership dues for each reregistering member, in the form of credit or debit card, PayPal, or program credits (you will need the program credit certificate code for each girl using program credits).
- 3. Once we receive your reregistering information, we will send you an email to send to all new girls and new adults joining your troop. (Be sure to include your name, email, and troop number when you send it to them, as they will need this info to register!) The email you send them will include a link where they can submit all necessary information, along with their membership dues. You will receive confirmation when they have done so. That's it!

#### To Register a New Troop:

Troops of all new girl and adult members will need to have parents (of girl members) and adult members complete the appropriate registration form provided in your troop packet, collect the membership dues (\$30 for girls, \$25 for adults) for each person, and mail or deliver the membership forms and membership dues to the Girl Scout Center. This can also be completed online.

Please register a Troop Cookie Sale Manager when you register your troop.

## Preparing New Troop Leaders

We want all new troop leaders to feel confident, prepared, and ready to lead their troop. Girl Scouts of Manitou Council requires each troop to have at least one leader who has completed the full training.

# Step One: In-person orientation with troop organizer or staff member (Approximately one hour)

New leaders will learn about the basics of Girl Scouting, how to access the information they need, how to get assistance, how to access the vital tools in MY GS (the Volunteer Toolkit, gsLearn), and how to access the following onboarding trainings there.

# <u>Step Two: Complete online trainings on gsLearn (self-paced, approximately one hour and 15 minutes)</u>

- GSUSA New Leader Onboarding Your First Troop Meeting: This course guides you through planning a successful first meeting that welcomes girls and sets the tone for the year.
- GSUSA New Leader Onboarding What Girl Scouts Do? (age level specific): Uncover the exciting world of Girl Scouts, exploring the program for each age level and the amazing experiences it offers girls.
- GSUSA New Leader Onboarding Troop Safety: Learn essential safety protocols to keep your troop safe during activities and outings.
- GSUSA New Leader Onboarding Funding the Fun: Explore options for financing troop activities, including budgeting, fundraising, and the Girl Scout Cookie Program.
- OPTIONAL: GSUSA New Leader Onboarding Engaging Families and Planning Your Parent Meeting

Following completion of each onboarding section, watch for an email with local council details pertaining to that topic. By completing these onboarding courses, you'll gain the confidence to lead your troop and create a fun and rewarding experience for the girls. The entire training must be completed by new leaders within three months of appointment.

# First Aid and CPR Certification

Many community organizations such as hospitals, clinics, fire departments, and technical colleges offer first aid and CPR courses to the general public. Organizations might even set up a private class if there is a small group of students wishing to take the class. **American Heart Association** and **The Red Cross** offer an online/blended course which may be a great option if you cannot find an in-person class.

Manitou Council's Program Specialist, Abby Weber, is working on getting her certification to teach these classes. We will have more information on in-house class opportunities soon.

#### 2025 Girl Scout Cookie Sale



With each new cookie sale season, Girl Scout entrepreneurs embrace the possibility of all the excitement that lies ahead. This year's theme is Embrace Possibilities and the mascot is a panda!

In 2025, cookies will sell for \$6 and \$7 for specialty cookies (S'mores and Toffee Tastic). Troops will earn \$1.10 per box in troop proceeds in 2025.

#### **Important Cookie Sale Dates**

- **January 1:** Digital Cookie open for all orders. Door-to-door sales begin.
- January 1-19: Door-to-door sales.
- **January 19:** Girl orders due to troop cookie sale manager.
- **January 19 March 16:** Digital Cookie will remain open for donated and shipped orders only.
- **January 20, 11:59 p.m.:** Troop cookie sale manager submits order via eBudde.
- **February 4:** Troops can preorder and pick up cookies for cookie booths from local cupboards.
- **February 5 March 16:** Booth sales. Troops can begin holding booth sales at Festival Foods on February 5, and then at Pick'N Save stores on February 6. Troops can schedule their own booth sale with a local place of business.
- **February 7-17:** Delivery to local communities/troops. Community Cookie Sale Managers will know the date of their delivery by November 2024.
- **February 28:** Girl monies due to troop.
- **March 3:** Troops deposit into their troop account.
- **March 4:** Girl Scouts of Manitou Council debits troop accounts 65% owed to council.
- **March 18:** Final girl/troop rewards orders due to be submitted via eBudde.
- **March 24:** Final debit of troop accounts for balance owed to council.
- **April 22 (approximately):** Troop cookie sale managers will receive girl rewards.
