Wear It Where?

She's earning badges, patches, and awards—but where do they belong? Here's the rundown of what goes where on her tunic, sash, or vest.

Flag patch, council name patches, and troop numbers go on the front right, in that order, starting at the top.

Badges and Journey awards always go on the front, starting at the bottom. On a vest, badges go on the right and Journey awards on the left. On a sash, badges go below Journey awards.

Fun patches from trips and experiences always go on the back.

And the Award Goes to...

From protecting our environment and supporting communities to changing laws, we know girls shine brightest when they're making the world a better place. That's why we have three separate awards—the **Girl Scout Gold, Silver, and Bronze Awards**—to honor Girl Scouts who take their passions and turn them into actions in big ways.

► **Daisies and Brownies** learn the basics of what it means to be a good neighbor and how they can be helpful.

► **Juniors** can earn the Bronze Award by teaming up with other girls to make a difference in their towns.

► **Cadettes** can earn the Silver Award by researching an issue, making a plan, and taking action to improve their communities.

► **Seniors and Ambassadors** can earn the Gold Award by developing and carrying out lasting solutions to issues in their neighborhoods and beyond. Gold Award Girl Scouts are eligible for many college scholarships, including a \$5,000 scholarship to one Gold Award Girl Scout each year in our council. Learn more at girlscouts.org/scholarships.

Cookie Sale Builds Entrepreneurs

As a Girl Scout, your daughter will participate in the world's largest girl-led entrepreneurial program: the Girl Scout Cookie Program! When she sells cookies, she'll develop real-world skills in five essential areas that will stick with her for life:

GOAL SETTING

Girl Scouts learn how to set goals and create a plan to reach them.

DECISION MAKING

Girl Scouts learn to make decisions on their own and as a team.

MONEY MANAGEMENT

Girl Scouts learn to create a budget and handle money.

PEOPLE SKILLS

Girl Scouts find their voices and build confidence through customer interactions.

BUSINESS ETHICS

Girl Scouts learn to act ethically, both in business and life.

Beyond learning these important skills, the Girl Scout Cookie Program supports her troop's ambitions. All Girl Scout Cookie proceeds stay local and fund nearly 90% of troop activities. As a troop, they decide what to do with their proceeds. So whether they decide to visit a nature center to go tree climbing, buy materials to make pet toys and beds to donate to a local animal shelter, or save proceeds for multiple years to take an epic trip across the country, they can do so because of the Girl Scout Cookie Program.

Girls and troops can earn special Cookie Business and Financial Literacy badges each year they run their own cookie business to take their skill-building to the next level and get the most out of the Cookie Program.

The Cookie Program is the activity that Girl Scouts say they most enjoy doing with their family. Take her experience a step further by earning the Girl Scout Cookie Entrepreneur Family Pin with your girl, and give her the business smarts of tomorrow today! Digital Cookie

Beyond selling cookies door-to-door, all Girl Scouts should utilize Digital Cookie! This online platform allows girls to supercharge their cookie business and learn new skills in digital marketing and e-commerce.

Girls who sell door-to-door and via Digital Cookie sell more cookies than girls who just use traditional sales methods. And there are special awards she can earn only by using Digital Cookie!

Girls easily personalize their cookie site, send their site to customers, and track their progress. Customers pay for their cookie orders with a credit card. Digital Cookie orders can be delivered by your daughter, shipped directly to the customer, or donated to a local organization of their troop's choosing.



Every Girl Deserves the Chance to Camp!

As a Girl Scouts of Manitou Council member, you and your daughter have access to two incredible Girl Scout camps: Camp Evelyn in Plymouth and Camp Manitou near Two Rivers.

At Girl Scout summer camp, girls will laugh, make new friends, try things they never thought they could do, gain independence and valuable leadership skills, and most importantly, HAVE FUN! Summer camp is open to all girls ages 5-17. She can come for the day, for three, five, or even 12 nights. Payment plans are also available, allowing for additional time to pay camp fees. We offer multiple events throughout the spring for your family or your daughter's troop to see camp and get your questions answered ahead of the camping season. If you have 1-2 hours a week, offer to...

Lead part of a troop meeting or guide the troop on earning a specific badge.



If you have 2-3 hours a week, offer to...

Become a cookie volunteer for your troop. You'll play a key part in the cookie program!



If you have 2-3 hours a week, offer to...

Become a co-leader for the troop and make a difference in the lives of girls all year long.
